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MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

his is my last message to you as chairman of the PCFI Board since my term expires on the 13th of May this year. When I assumed the chairmanship in May of 2010, I was fully aware that this position would be a thankless job- one that would require an endless sense of sacrifice of time. effort and resources for the welfare of this Foundation that we all love. Having been one of those who were there from the very beginning, I knew this firsthand. Remembering our past sacrifices since 1995, when we started clearing this swampy land from nowhere the day of Sampaguita Ball that year and the PCFI Board working together as one all these years to build a cultural complex that is the envy of so many and recalling the examples of tenacity, determination and hard work set by all of my predecessors, have helped me to focus my energy in doing what was expected of me.

In my Tambuli message in the PhilFest 2011 issue, I wrote that the third and final phase of the paving of our festival grounds was yet to be done. Everyone will recall that it was finished before Philfest 2011. Re-paving of the cracked access road between the Bayanihan Arts and Events Center and the Philippine Village has been finished, too, thanks to the initiative of our Business Operations Manager, Rudy Bautista, with the approval of the Board. The Board has also approved the building of a new restroom, now at the permitting stage, at the Finance office.

The Bahay Kubo has been finished and, with the construction of the handicapped ramp required by federal law, is finally open to the public. The offering of free Basic Conversational Tagalog classes has been revived and, depending on public demand, will be continued in the immediate future. A class in Philippine Customs and Traditions will also be taught.

We now have nineteen (19) member organizations, three of which joined during this administration. These are the Fil-Am Club of Pinellas County, the Fil-Am Social Club of Pasco and Hernando County, and our latest one, APO, Florida (Alpha Phi Omega Philippines) Alumni Association of Florida, which is a service-oriented organization that is actively involved in various community projects. They have volunteered to provide security this PhilFest. The Fil-Am Club of Pinellas pavilion has finally been finished and the Philippine Medical Society is in the final stages of planning to build their own pavilion beside the PAPAG pavilion.

Our PCFI cultural programs are up and running, thanks to our untiring Cultural Affairs chairman, Olivia Santiano, who always emphasizes that PCFI. first and foremost, is a cultural Foundation. The Philippine Performing Arts Company dancers under the direction of talented choreographer, Joey Omila, are rehearsing for their gala, Dances of the Philippines, to be held on May 26, 2012, at the Straz Center for the Performing Arts. Nhick Pacis, PCFI Musical Director and conductor of our Bamboo Orchestra, is now directing the sarzuela, Ana Maria, the premier performance of which will be at the Bayanihan Arts and Events Center on Saturday and Sunday this PhilFest. Rehearsals are in full swing.

I would like to reiterate my sincerest thanks to the Board of Directors who have worked with me in making important decisions which have led to our significant achievements. We never lost sight of the fact that we are here to work hand in hand for the ultimate welfare of this Foundation that is so close to our hearts. Let us not forget to continue displaying a track record of service, dedication and support for all the cultural activities of PCFI so that the next generation of Filipinos here in Tampa Bay will be eager to keep up the good work we have started.

We hope to see all of you and your families, friends, and acquaintances this PhilFest having a whale of a grand time. It will be a weekend you won't soon forget!

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PHILFEST 2012 IS HERE!!

hilFest 2012 on March 30-April 1, the much-awaited three much-awaited three-day signature festival put on by the Philippine Cultural Foundation, Inc., is its premier fund-raising event to raise funds for the maintenance and upkeep of the Philippine Cultural Enrichment Complex. On this 17th PhilFest the PhilFest committee with Roger Caculitan as chairman and Lucy Bautista, Ross Balderama and Roy Covarrubias as his vice-chairmen, and twenty-three other committees have been busy with their preparations. In the coming weeks they will transform the Philippine Village into a typical Filipino fiesta where Filipinos can mingle with others from the motherland and exchange news and pleasantries.

With about 12,000 expected to attend, PhilFest will be sure to give opportunities for people of all nationalities and ethnic backgrounds to experience Philippine culture firsthand, albeit only for a day or two or all three days. This festival also bridges the apparent cultural gap between Filipinos raised the traditional way and their offspring born here in the United States or elsewhere.

With an expected 11-000-12,000 people attending, PhilFest will be sure to offer to Filipinos and non- Filipinos chances to satisfy all kinds of palates with culinary offerings from vendors and caterers from different parts of the Philippines, all housed in colorful booths with barrio festival themes . Handicrafts , costumes and fashion accessories will be sold by various artists and vendors and different cultural performances and exhibitions will enthrall the audience., both at the Philippine Village and at the Bayanihan Arts and Events Center.

Friday, the 30th of March starts at 5:00 with music by Aba Villagomeza and the presentation of the Mrs. PhilFest candidates with their association presidents at 7:00 P.M. The cultural extravaganza by our three cultural arms (the Philippine Performing Arts Company, the Philippine Choral Group and the Bamboo Orchestra) will follow . The G.A. Hour at 8:00 will be presented by G.A. Pinky, exclusive media sponsor, highlighted by the performance by Jay-R,, Prince of Pop. R & B of the Philippines, who is also a dancer and actor. TAWAG NG TANGHALAN, the Filipino counterpart of American Idol, will follow, after which the festival closes for the night.

Saturday, the 31st of March, is our busiest day and will offer an variety of song and dance performances, as well as exhibitions by various groups and individuals. From 10:00-5:00 the cultural exhibits may been at the Bayanihan Arts and Events Center... Then at 2:00 visitors may watch the premier performance of the Tagalog sarzuela, Ana Maria. If you miss it on Saturday you will have another chance to see it if you consult the entertainment schedule. Meanwhile, at the Sinagtala stage different

performances of song, dance, Arnis Karate., etc., will be presented.

At 1:00 P.M. TFC (The Filipino Channel) will present the TFC Hour, exclusive media sponsor, featuring Sheryn Regis, Monette Rivera of Adobo Nation, and Don Tagala, exclusive TFC correspondent. The public will also witness the presentation of certitudes to the graduated of the Conversational Tagalog class offered through the auspices of PCFI. Following will the talent portion of the Mrs. PhilFest contes, after which the Mrs. PhilFest/Grand Flores de PhilFest parade will follow. This will feature beautiful women and young girls in their most exquisite Filipino costumes and ;long gowns, escorted by dashing young boys and men in their Barong Tagalog, all in colorful arcos parading around the festival grounds.

For years now th4 highlight of the evening which involves the youth, our promise of tomorrow, is REVOLUTION 2012. This is a hip-hop competition of young Fil-Ams from different schools and colleges, which has for its able chairs, the effervescent Melissa Barrido and Michelle Lebrias. It is so



satisfying to see our young people coming in droves to root for their choices of winners.

Sunday will open later than the day before (11:00), but after musical performances on the stage, TANGHALANG PAMBATA, the children's version of TAWAG NG TANGHALAN will be presented. Another cultural crowd getter is YUGYUGAN 2012, street dancing participated in by various associations, individuals and even the public , all in colorful costume and marching to a beat unique to the dance steps. Then the coronation of the Mrs. PhilFest winners will follow, after which will follow the presentation sure to please all fashionistas, the Philippine fashion show. After that the Grand Raffle Drawing will follow.

Again this year we are very fortunate to have the Consulate-on-Wheels team headed by our Philippine Consul General, Ding Nolasco, to provide consular services to the public, culminating in a Dual Citizenship Oath taking t th Sampaguita Grand Hall of the Bayanihan Arts and Events Center at 2:00 P.M.on Sunday.










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
ANA MARIA: A FILIPINO SARZUELA PRODUCTION AT PHILFEST

Conversational Tagalog Classes at the bahay Kubo

In 2003 the Philippine Cultural Foundation, Inc., started giving cultural education classes through the initiative of then PCFI Board secretary and legal counsel, Bob Ruelo, and the untiring efforts of Mr. Rey Aquino, who volunteered his services as Tagalog class teacher and Mrs. Unidad Bonoan, as the volunteer Philippine Customs and Traditions teacher. In 2006 the teaching of Tagalog to interested students was revived, again with Mr. Rey Aquino as the volunteer teacher.

In keeping up with PCFI's goal of presenting opportunities for the public to increase their knowledge of Philippine language and culture, a free Basic Conversational Tagalog class was started on January 21, 2012, through the efforts of Angie Caculitan, chairman for PCFI cultural classes, in the Bahay Kubo at the Philippine Village. Mrs. Janet Trinidad Weglarz has graciously volunteered her services as the Conversational Tagalog class teacher, with Noel and Soccoro Pulido as volunteer helpers. The students vary in ages and backgrounds. Some are teens and young adults born in the United States of Filipino parents or of mixed marriages with one Filipino parent, while some students are couples.

Others are Americans married to Filipinos, while

some were born in the Philippines of Filipino parents or mixed marriages with one Filipino parent and who grew up here in the United States. It is indeed a delight to observe this Tagalog class in action, with Mrs. Weglarz communicating only in Tagalog to teach the students how to communicate in Tagalog in different settings and learn Philippine songs.

Certificates will be awarded to these hardworking students at PhilFest on Saturday, March 31, at the Sinagtala stage. Expect the graduates to show the audience some things they have learned.







The Philippine Performing Arts Company, Inc. (PPAC) is

CONSULATE-ON-WHEELS: THE BAYANIHAN EXPERIENCE By Mel Allego

aving arrived five minutes early, I L took a stroll through the lobby of the Bayanihan Arts and Events Center and glanced over the crowd of Filipino faces silent with smiles of anticipation for their names to be called. Eager to rush forward and finally unload the emotional burden and anxiety of the passport renewal process, their eves were focused towards Bavanihan Director Rudy Bautista and the Philippine American Chamber of Commerce (PACC) volunteers, gathered around the check-in desk, for some sense of guidance or direction. Filipino-time need not apply to them, for they were required to book their appointments several months in advance. Silently moving past them, between the Library and Ann Bartlett's Office, various Filipino dialects bounced in echo off of neutral-painted walls and crisp floor tiles as the Garden Veranda awaited me just beyond the glass door at the end of the hallway.

As the crisp cool morning gave way to the warmth of the rising sun, I sat amongst the black iron tables along Plaza Barrido facing the parking lot, while observing passport renewal candidates walking hastily from their cars to the Bayanihan. A young Filipino boy, about the age of 5, was playing with his green toy monster truck atop a table when his Lolo, a distinguished and proud looking man dressed in traditional Barong Tagalog, called for him to return. A man, whom I presumed was the boy's father, quickly ran up to join them carrying a small blue jacket and an armful of government documents. Wrestling the jacket onto his son and over his tightly clenched toy, he ushered them all towards the entrance, where his wife waited anxiously at the door.

Looking down at my watch, the time read 9:05. I stood from my seat, grabbed one more breath of fresh air and walked back into the Bayanihan. Inside, I found a seat next to

PACC President Renato Boac at a neatly arranged check-in desk with stacks of passport application forms, voting forms, two appointment lists and a cash box. Suddenly a wave of people came forward with questions regarding forms, priority mail envelopes, walk-in availabilities, and appointment times. Handing each issue without a hitch, we received the go-ahead from the Consul to begin accepting applicants. Philippine Nationals came from all across Florida, including Miami, Orlando, Kissimmee, Jacksonville and Tampa, for this opportunity to renew their passports locally and forego the hassle and expense of traveling to Washington, D.C. With each passing candidate, I could see the gratitude and relief in their faces as they hurried passed me towards the Consulate stations.

Over the course of two days, the 26th and 27th of November, volunteers from the Philippine Cultural Foundation, Inc., The Philippine-American Chamber of Commerce of Tampa Bay and members of the Philippine Consulate were able to process and approve 180 passport renewal candidates, which included 20 unscheduled walk-ins, before having to close their doors at 6:00 pm on Sunday. Consider their efforts a testament to Filipino efficiency, and willingness to serve and assist their fellow Kababayans through this passport renewal process, which could have been fraught with various pressures, anxieties, emotions and uncertainties. With over five years of experience in the Philippine Consulate-On-Wheels program, local Tampa Bay volunteers have been able to accommodate and serve their fellow Filipinos with compassion, patience, a positive attitude and a welcoming smile.

For those of you interested in ePassport renewal, application for a new ePassport, and applications for Report of Birth and Report of Marriage at the next Consulate-On-Wheels program in Tampa Bay, visit the Philippine Cultural Foundation, Inc. website for information and appointments. Please, make sure to schedule with the Philippine Consulate months in advance in order to maintain a quick and efficient passport renewal process, and to assure a pleasant and enjoyable experience for everyone. 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


t last the longtime dream of replicating the Bahay Kubo, (a typical Philippine house made of bamboo and coconut) at the Philippine Cultural Enrichment Complex has gone into fruition. The dream and concept was started during the term of then PCFI president Claire Ick, visualized by and artistically rendered by PCFI Board member Robert Enriquez, and the fundraising for which enthusiastic PCFI board member Sylvia de la Cruz eagerly started. With funds raised through various fundraising events and donations of Tampa Bay community members, construction was started during the term of Bing Santiano as PCFI Chairman and finished during current PCFI Chairman Roger Caculitan's term.

Before PhilFest 2011 beautiful landscaping was started, and still is being continued, around the Bahay Kubo. This has been made possible through very generous monetary and in-kind donations from different community members. A very civic-minded Tampa family gave a donation for the construction of a beautiful

bridge with steel railing over the pond. The latest addition to the Bahay Kubo is the handicapped ramp required by federal law. This was made possible through the donations of generous donors. Also started is the beautification of the building interior. Another magnanimous donor made possible the installation of sawali, (woven bamboo) on one of the walls and wainscotting on another wall. There are plans to furnish the interior with authentic Philippine furniture and accessories.

The Bahay Kubo has become an interesting and attention-grabbing focal point in our Philippine Village as a cultural monument and a venue for educational tours by students and the general public, as well as tourists. It is currently being used for the free Tagalog class, which started last January. This PhilFest the Bahay Kubo will finally be open to the public.

PCFI RALLIES WITH TAMPA BAY COMMUNITY TO SUPPORT PHILIPPINE DRAGON BOAT TEAM

The week of August 4 to 9, 2011 will forever be etched in the memories of both the Pinoy Dragon Boat Warriors and the Tampa Bay community. The 2011 World Dragon Boat Championship Races were held in Tampa Bay and, being the current defending champions of the sport, our Pinoy Dragon Boat Warriors defied all odds to come and defend their title. Little did they know that in the hearts of the Filipino community of the area, the bayanihan spirit and a strong sense of unity, which Filipinos are well known for, is deeply and unconditionally ingrained in the hearts of us all.

On Tuesday, August 2, 2011, the Opening Ceremonies for the races were held and a handful of Filipinos and Filipino- Americans, including Roger L. Caculitan, Chairman of the Board of PCFI, were in attendance. It was here where everyone learned of the Warriors' pathetic storyhow they came here with lack of support from the Philippine government, with absolutely no budget for their meals and snacks. That same evening young Filipino-Americans went to work, buying groceries, taking rice cookers and other cooking utensils to the delegates' hotel and providing meals for them that evening and the following day, Wednesday.

Roger Caculitan committed to work together with Gail Hernandez Gutierrez, the Warriors' local contact person.. He immediately mobilized the PCFI Board and asked for commitment from some of PCFI 's 14 member organizations. As expected an overwhelming show of support came from members of the Tampa Bay Sports Club, Ilocano USA, Bicol Association of South Florida, the Sampaguita Ladies, Pilipino American Association of Tampa, Ang Kaliwat Bolanon sa Florida, Philippine American Chamber of Commerce of Tampa Bay, the Philippine Choral Group, the Philippine Nurses Associations of both Tampa Bay and Gulf Coast, the Philippine Medical Society and the Philippine Medical Society Auxiliary. As the title of the 2011 World Dragon Boat Races Champion was announced and everyone was asked to stand at attention for the raising of the Filipino flag to the wonderful rendition of our Philippine National Anthem by Cara Gutierrez, 10-year old Filipino-American, many Pinoys in the crowd shed a tear or two, in jubilation for and pride in our athletes.

On Monday, August 8, Ann Bartlett and Ferdian Jap, led a group of young Fil-Ams in honoring the World Champions with a sumptuous luncheon buffet at the Bayanihan Arts and Events. On hand were members of the PCFI Board, as well as supporters from the Tampa Bay Filipino community. Plaques were awarded by Roger Caculitan to the members of the Philippine Dragon Boat Team, to Gail Gutierrez for her incredible work of meticulously tending to the athletes' daily needs, leaving no distraction on their part and devoting 100% concentration on their races, and to Ann Bartlett and company for the luncheon buffet in honor of our athletes.
